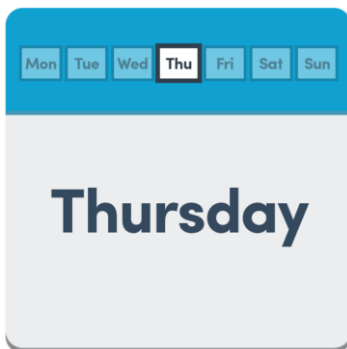

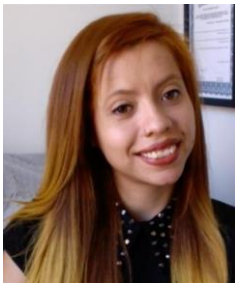

Johanna gave a presentation so we could learn about logo's for example what a logo is and why its important.

What is a logo ?



We started by having a guess the logo quiz



We learned that logos:

Can use colours, words, pictures and shapes to make a symbol. This symbol is then called a logo.



A logo needs to grab you attention and be easy to spot.



A logo offers a quick and easy way to remember what you will find when you see it.

When are logo's most useful for you?



Logo's are used in lots of different places for example

- On the outside of a shop
- On items in the supermarket
- In letters or on information you see



HYS said :

Logo's help you find things easily when you are out, especially if you are somewhere new.



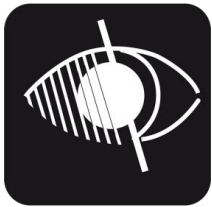
Logo's give you the same information outside the shop and again when you are inside the shop. This can be reassuring.

Using a picture in your logo



HYS said :

Using a picture that easily shows what something is about can be really helpful.



When logo's are used online, you can add a an picture description that helps people who have a visual impairment know what is in the picture.



Using a picture in our logo that easily shows what HYS is about could help make picture descriptions another way to understand what the group is about.



Having the name in the logo is helpful as it gives more clues as to what the group is about

What does HYS make you think of?



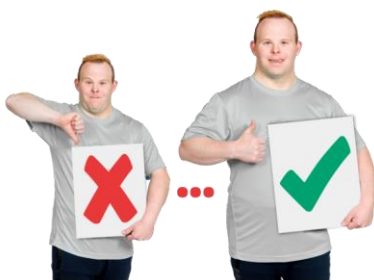
To help us think about what picture might help easily show what HYS is about we talked about what comes to mind when we think about HYS.

You can help each other.



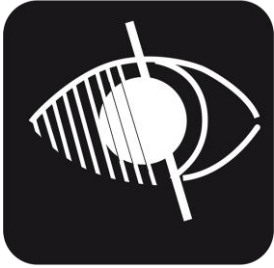
Meeting new people

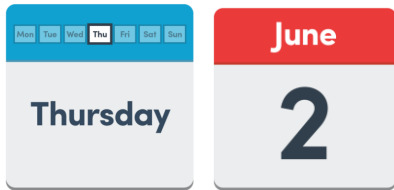


Why It is important that colours go well together and that they are nice to look at

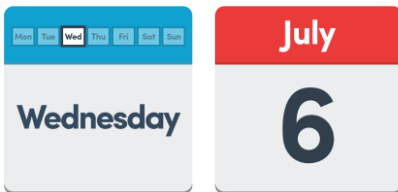
Other business: Upcoming meetings

A HYS member would like to note that they would like a meeting to talk about accessibility when out shopping.

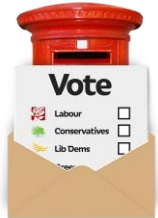
For example when using a wheelchair
