Evaluations will be out soon so please look out for this. If anyone would like support to complete their evaluation then please let Gayle know.






Staffing levels

Not everyone is getting their full 1:1 support hours. This can be

- reduced hours
- getting group support instead of 1:1 support
- shorter 2:1 shifts are harder to cover in some support services.



There can be a lot of changes to rotas which is confusing and stressful.



The missed support hours are not given back and some people are unsure why this is.



Another HYS member mentioned that they are not able to use staff cars the way that they used to. This means they can't always do the things they enjoy.
